Oxford University is the oldest English-speaking University in the world, with evidence of its existence dating as far back as the 11th century. It is a private research university that is located in Oxford, England, and is considered a city university, meaning that the school does not have a main campus; rather, several colleges and schools within the university are scattered around the city of Oxford. It is well-known for being home of the Rhodes scholarship, operating the oldest university museum in the world and having the largest academy library system in England. The University of Oxford contributes around £5.8 billion to the UK economy, and supports more than 50,000 full time jobs. Globally, the impact is £7.1 billion.
