Building self-esteem, wellbeing and life skills, the Mayor's Fund was established by Boris Johnson during his tenure as Mayor of London, and has raised millions of pounds for social mobility projects assisting young people in London to escape poverty through making the most of their abilities and nurturing aspiration. By making individual grants and grants to organizations, the Mayor's Fund assists young people with building a better future for themselves and their families by harnessing and growing their own potential.

Focusing on Wellbeing, imparting Skills, Employment and Enterprise – the Mayor's Fund is helping young Londoners to acquire the skills they need to progress and prosper – imbuing them with a self-esteem and self-belief that ushers in a 360 de-

gree positive turnaround in their personality.

2015-16 Final Impact Report suggests that just in this particular calendar year 33,000 young Londoners in every borough are directly impacted by its various projects, 15,200 pupils received support in numeracy through the 'Count on Us' projects, and more than 500 young Londoners have found employment after engaging with the employment programs.

The Charity, which is non-political, has no endowed funds and as an in-

dependent charity receives no core funding from the GLA. Rather, it relies on the support of companies, individuals, trusts and foundations and the public. They are redoubling the efforts to raise money for their programs and are excited that encouraging greater philanthropy is the utmost priority of the Mayor and his team.
